	Homework club at lunchtime has been well attended and children have the opportunity to complete homework tasks in school, with adult support if needed and therefore hand them in on time.

	<p>and pupils have improved their basic literacy and numeracy skills.</p> <p>Attendance is never less than 86.5% for those children / families supported by the CFSW with 41% of children having attendance above 97%</p> <p>2014 End of Key Stage 2 results (pupil premium): Reading – 100% made expected progress with 75% making more than expected progress. Writing – 100% made expected progress with 40% making more than expected progress Maths – 60% made expected progress with 40% making more than expected progress.</p>
<p>Teacher led coaching groups</p>	<p>Children have worked in a small group and now have a variety of coaching strategies to use in lessons. 77%of children said that they were now more confident in all / some lessons. 84% of children had noticed an improvement in the accuracy of all / some of their work. 88% of children had noticed an improvement in the quality of all / some of their work. In Year 6 four children (57%) had narrowed the gap between their peers making 1 sub level progress.</p>

<p>SCKids holiday and after school club Residential visits to York and Redridge Trips</p>	<p>Pupils have had the opportunity to attend sessions at SCKids holiday club and experience the variety of activities on offer and mix with friends and peers outside of the school day. Families have had access to one free hour of before or after school care weekly to ease possible financial burden. Pupils have been exposed to new opportunities and have experienced a residential visit. These opportunities have allowed them to fully engage with the curriculum alongside their peers.</p>
