Welcome back! I hope that you all had an enjoyable summer!

It has been an excellent start to the new academic year! All of the children appear to have settled in to new classes and new routines exceedingly quickly. It really feels as though we have never been away! I am once again exceptionally impressed by the way that our new Y3 children have become a part of the school and I look forward to getting to know them even better over the coming months, along with their parents.

A new school year has brought with it a new organizational layout and many of you have been very complimentary about the new reception area. It brings a fresh, professional look to the school, providing a clear identity and focus as you walk through the gate and a calm, ordered waiting area for visitors. It has also further improved the security of the site, allowing the office staff to effectively manage access to the building throughout the day.

The reception will be open from 8.30am until 4.00pm and becomes the main entrance into school, although children will still use the access via the playground and  $SC_K$ ids via the car park. Should you wish to speak to someone or your child attends Early Birds, please come to reception from 8.30am and one of the administrative team will take care of you.

In assembly this week, I have been sharing with the children and the staff what I am calling our Teamship Rules. These are the qualities and competences we hold dear as we "strive for excellence". These are:

- 1. Be relentless
- 2. Right place, right time, right kit, right mind
- 3. High personal standards
- 4. Be purposeful / intentional
- 5. Ask for forgiveness, not permission
- 6. Only do what is beneficial
- 7. Remain positive / optimistic

Over the coming months we will explore these even further as we aim to become the best that we can be. ## Parent Pay

## Music Tuition

After much planning and careful financial management we were able at the end of last term to confirm the Y4 Wider Opportunities music scheme that has been so successful over the last few years. This means that everyone in Y4 will continue to receive music tuition as part of our ongoing collaboration with Solihull Music Service. We are still in the process of organizing this and expect this to begin the week beginning 16<sup>th</sup> September. All other music tuition from Solihull Music visiting teachers, such as brass, quitar and violins, will begin next week.



Over the summer I have been in regular contact with a local resident about the problems posed by parking in Woodlea Drive. We are in the process of setting up a meeting with residents, police, Solihull Council and even the local MP to try and address this matter. Can I ask that parents consider how and where they park when dropping off and collecting children. In particular, it has been noted that some parents still illegally park on the double yellow lines. Please be aware that we noted the presence of a PCSO and Traffic Warden this week around the school. In line with the current Change4Life campaign it may even be beneficial to park a few minutes further away from the school and walk the remainder of the way. At the start of the new year, we would also like to remind parents that as a school, we feel that in the best interests of safety, children in Y3 and Y4 should be brought to and collected from school by an adult. For those children in Y5 and Y6 we feel that it is more appropriate for them to arrive at school or leave the school premises unaccompanied, either meeting an adult or older sibling at a nearby agreed point or making their own way home.



Obviously children mature at different rates and some are more responsible than others. Ultimately this is a parents' decision and we can only offer our thoughts and advice.

Can we also remind parents that the school gates officially open at 8.30am, when an adult will be on duty to supervise children in the playground until school opens at 8.45am. Children should not be on the school site before this time, unless attending  $SC_K$ ids.

School officially begins at 8.55am. Children arriving after this time will then be considered late. Anyone arriving after 9.10am will need to be signed into school by an accompanying adult and will be marked as late after close of register, meaning that they will miss a mark in their attendance.



## Uniform

We are currently still observing the summer uniform policy. This means that ties are optional, polo shirts may be worn, girls can wear gingham dresses and boys can wear grey short trousers.

The winter uniform of shirt and tie for boys and blouse or shirt and tie for girls will begin from 4<sup>th</sup> November.



## Healthy Snacks

Please note that children should only bring fruit into school for a breaktime snack from Monday to Thursday. On a Friday, they can bring any small snack of their choice, ie a chocolate biscuit, packet of crisps or a cheesy string.



## Nut Allergies

Please be advised that we do have several children in school who have significant allergies to nuts. Whilst we do not ban nut products from school, we do strongly suggest to parents that any food sent into school should be as nut free as possible in order to avoid serious incidents.

## SC\_Kids

Please note that any places offered at  $SC_K$ ids before and after school club are subject to contract. Registration forms need to be completed prior to any child attending the club. Sadly, we cannot offer a place to any child arriving at the club without registration forms already having been completed.

Although we do have some places still available, they are now becoming very limited, particularly on a Monday and Tuesday.



Children are allowed to wear a watch, earrings and any other jewellery that has a recognised religious significance to school. Earrings should take the form of either studs or sleepers. These cannot be worn for <u>any</u> physical activity, such as PE or swimming in the interests of the child's health and safety. Please note that staff are not allowed to remove these and that we accept no responsibility for the safekeeping of any item. Neither do we provide or accept the wearing of tape or plasters over them.



Therefore on days when your child does planned physical activity, either in or out of school we would ask that such items are not worn. Should your child not be able to remove the earrings themselves, they will not be allowed to participate. Details of when your child does planned physical activity in school will be in their home-school diaries. Should this not be the case, please check with your child's class teacher.



#### Home School Diaries

Your child will this week have brought home their new Home School Diary. This has a new design this year after consultation with parents to ensure that it does everything we want it to do.

The front cover was designed by Mitchell Dean, one of our Y4 children.

It is important to note that the diary needs to be signed by in certain areas by children and parents. In particular the Diary Agreement, Class Rules, Homework and Acceptable Technology Usage pages should be read and discussed with the child.
