As part of our ongoing commitment to children's safety, Mrs Ferguson and I have this week attended the annual Solihull Designated Member of Staff [DMS] for child protection conference. This keeps us up to date with all of the crucial information, best practices and statutory requirements, as well as helping us to consider our own practices and how we can continue to improve our service.

I therefore thought that I'd take this opportunity to share with you the [NSPCC PANTS](#) Campaign. The Underwear Rule is a simple way that parents can help keep children safe from abuse - without using scary words or mentioning sex.

They've developed a simple [guide for parents](#), and a [child-friendly version](#), to help you talk PANTS with your child.

Whilst an unusual title, the rule helps children to remember key advice and reflects the nature of the advice given in a non-threatening way.

P - Private. All areas covered by underwear is private and therefore no-one else's business!

A - Always. Always remember your body belongs to you!

N - No! You have the right to say "No" to unwanted attentions or touches.

T - Talk. Talk to people about things that make you uncomfortable, nervous or scared.

S - Speak up! If in doubt, speak to someone about what is happening.

Small, open and honest conversations are the best way to introduce the Underwear Rule to your child and talk about keeping safe. Inevitably your child will have questions, so listen carefully and attentively and be straightforward in your answers. You know your child best of all, so adapt the conversation and talk in a way that feels right for you both.

These five simple rules will help our children to feel safe and remain safe.
